MOVIE OF THE MONTH:

SUPER 8

With Steven Spielberg, the director of such classic sci-fis as *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*, *E.T.* and *Minority Report*, off focusing on and directing other things (he has *The Adventures of Tintin* and *War Horse* coming out within the next six months), when the time comes for a sci-fi that harkens back to those films the world needs a director that everyone can trust enough to provide the goods.

Enter J.J. Abrams, the creator of *Alias* and *Lost* and not to mention the director of *Mission: Impossible 3* and *Star Trek*. That resume alone means that we can trust him with just about anything he touches. Together, these two forces unite (Abrams as director, Spielberg as producer) to create *Super 8*, a film that, just like Spielberg's *E.T.*, combines the sci-fi genre with the timeless coming-of-age story. Abrams, who also wrote the screenplay, has also managed to find a group of talented actors to take part in his first original screenplay. The cast includes Elle "sister of Dakota" Fanning (*Somewhere*), Kyle Chandler (*King Kong*), Ron Eldard (*Black Hawk Down*), Zach Mills (*Changeling*), Gabriel Basso (*The Big C*), Glynn

Turman (*The Wire*), Noah Emmerich (*The Truman Show*) and Bruce Greenwood (*Star Trek*), while young actors Joel Courtney, Riley Griffiths, and Ryan Lee make their movie debuts, Abrams' film is set in the summer of 1979, when a group of friends, including Joe (Courtney), Alice (Fanning), Charles (Griffiths), Preston (Mills), Martin (Basso) and Cary (Lee), decide to make a low-budget zombie movie on Charles' Super 8 camera for entry in a competition. One night, as they're shooting, they witness a horrific train crash which releases a mysterious creature from its cargo and into their town. Soon after, they begin to notice some strange occurrences throughout, and it's up to

them, as well as Joe's police officer father Jackson (Chandler), to work out what the creature is and what its true intentions are, before the US Army recaptures it. It promises to be one of the best films of the year so far, so don't miss it when it comes out on **August 5th**.

GUNFIGHT AT THE E.T. CORAL: COWBOYS AND ALIENS

February's *True Grit* reminded us that cowboys were still popular. Every other month seems to be filmed with alien films, so it's safely certain that aliens are still very much popular.

So, that fateful morning when studio executives decided to combine the two, it was either the best or worst thing to happen to fandom ever.

Either way, *Cowboys and Aliens* was born.

Director Jon Favreau (*Iron Man*) has rounded up an impressive cast to take part in this very special film, including Daniel Craig (*Casino Royale*), Harrison Ford (*Indiana Jones*), Olivia Wilde (*Tron Legacy*), Sam Rockwell (*Moon*), Noah Ringer (*The Last Airbender*) and Paul Dano (*Little Miss Sunshine*).

The story kicks off in 1873 Arizona, a man named Jake Lonergan (Craig) wakes up in the middle of the desert with no memory and a mysterious

shackle around his wrist. Upon entry of the town of Absolution, Jake learns that he's a wanted criminal that everyone, especially the town's ruthless ruler Colonel Dolarhyde (Ford), wants to get their hands on. However, Absolution faces an even greater threat when alien spaceships start to attack. Still with us? Okay, good. Anyway, it turns out that Jake's mysterious shackle is the key

to defeating the strange extraterrestrial beings, so Jake must team up with Dolarhyde and other former enemies to make a stand against the aliens.

Who'll be triumphant will be have to be seen on **August 19th**.

BUMDERS OF THE CENTURY: THE INBETWEENERS

The world loves idiots. Homer Simpson, Peter Griffin and Charlie Sheen come to mind in an instant, but for most British teenagers the idiocy (with positive effects) doesn't get higher with *The Inbetweeners*.

For the past few years, we have watched the hilarious antics of "briefcase mong" Will (Simon Bird), hopeless romantic Simon (Joe Thomas), compulsive liar Jay (James Buckley) and 100% idiot Neil (Blake Harrison) as they've gotten into various scrapes at nursing homes, caravan clubs and fashion shows (if you watch the show, you'll immediately recognize the references). But for their first, and presumably only, big-screen outing the boys are packing their bags for a trip to what is currently considered to be

the hottest destination for wild teenagers - that's right, the *Inbetweeners* are going to Malia!

But what exactly will they get up to over there? There have been various reports of this, but for the sake of viewer enjoyment I shall not spill the beans here - all I'll say is that this film will take the boys to entirely new levels of humiliation than ever before, and not everyone will come

out of the international experience in one piece.

I also hear rumours of Simon's endless pursuit of Carli D'Amato (Emily Head) reaching fever pitch, and also of the boys' sadistic teacher Mr. Gilbert (comedian Greg Davies) showing up in some capacity. These may be true, maybe not, but we'll hold tight and see what happens when this film is out on **August 19th**.

MONKEY BUSINESS: *RISE OF THE PLANET OF THE APES*

“Exactly how did the titular *Planet of the Apes* come about?” asked absolutely no-one when the studios announced that this prequel was in the works.

Rise of the Planet of the Apes (for that is the real title - quite a mouthful, is it not?) manages to answer this unasked question with a quality cast and astounding visual effects.

In reference to the latter, this is the first *Apes* film to not depict apes as humans under heavy make-up but rather as motion-captured CGI beings. And they've hired mo-cap saint Andy Serkis (*Lord of the Rings*) to provide such capture with the movie's main chimp... but more on him in a second.

Joining Serkis in the film, directed by Rupert Wyatt (*The Escapist*), are the likes of James Franco (*127 Hours*), Freida Pinto

(*Slumdog Millionaire*), John Lithgow (*Dexter*), Brian Cox (*X-Men 2*), Tom Felton (*Harry Potter*) and David Oyelowo (*The Last King of Scotland*). Franco plays Will Rodman, a man who is testing a new cure for Alzheimer's on apes, in particular a chimp named Caesar (Serkis, in mo-cap form). The drug enhances Caesar's thinking capabilities to the extent that he has the intelligence of a normal human being.

Although Caesar is treated with love and respect by Will and his Alzheimer's-suffering father (Lithgow), society still tests and contains him. Eventually, Caesar proves smart enough to escape from his contained cell and lead an ape revolution that will threaten to wipe out humans and make apes the dominant species on the planet. Apes will rise on **August 12th**.

TO BE HONEST, IT LOOKS SMURF: *THE SMURFS*

Just when you thought it was safe for children's cartoons to go back into the water...

This year, we've already had the dire *Yogi Bear* adaptation, so now Hollywood feels that it needs to have a go at yet another beloved children's classic, this time it's *The Smurfs*. However, while the Smurfs are traditionally set in a quiet, Medieval forest, this film apparently kicks it up a notch by being set in a modern-day New York City atmosphere.

You still with us, now? Okay, read on at your own risk...

Anyway, the film, directed by Raja Gosnell (the live-action *Scooby-Doo* films - already a sign of trouble), manages to have a decent cast supporting this movie, including - in live-action roles - Neil Patrick Harris (*How I Met Your Mother*), Jayma Mays (*Glee*), Hank Azaria (*Night At The Museum 2*) and Sofia Vergara (*Modern Family*), while in voice-over roles we have Jonathan Winters (the original

voice of Papa Smurf), singer Katy Perry, Anton Yelchin (*Star Trek*), Alan Cumming (*Spy Kids*) and George Lopez (*Rio*).

The plot introduces the Smurfs, including Papa Smurf (Winters), Smurfette (Perry) etc in their tiny village in the forest during the Middle Ages. Unfortunately their greatest nemesis, the evil wizard Gargamel (Azaria), finds them and chases them into a wooded area, where some of them

wander into a "forbidden" grotto and, via some ridiculous magical method, they are transported to New York. There, they take shelter with a married couple (Harris and Mays) as they try and find a way back to the village before Gargamel finds them. If you are still merely interested in seeing how this one will turn out (my prediction? Not well...), it's out on **August 12th**.

HAPPY FEET: MR. POPPER'S PENGUINS

Penguins are on the comeback trail, but with *Happy Feet 2* not out until Christmas the movie world needs something to whet its appetite. And so, along comes *Mr. Popper's Penguins*.

The Mark Waters (*Mean Girls*)-directed adaptation, based on the classic 1938 children's book, features Jim Carrey (*Bruce Almighty*) in the title role alongside a pack of real-life Gentoo penguins. To accommodate the latter, most scenes were filmed on a refrigerated set thereby making it more accessible for the little winged stars.

Joining Carrey in this family comedy are Carla Gugino (*Sucker Punch*), Ophelia Lovibond (*4.3.2.1*), Clarg Gregg (*Iron Man*) and Angela Lansbury (*Nanny McPhee*). Carrrey plays Mr. Tom Popper, a focused but

divorced businessman who, typically, does not have much time for his family. However, when his absent father dies, a crate arrives at Tom's doorstep containing a small Gentoo penguin. Eventually, Mr. Popper ends up with six penguins with whom he is forced to share his apartment when he realizes that their presence is helping him to reconnect with his estranged wife and children. He must now attempt to maintain his new

hold on his family and his new fluffy companions, as well as struggling to keep his job and avoid a local zoo representative who wants to put the penguins in custody. For some reason not holding out for a Christmas release, *Mr. Popper's Penguins* is out in the midst of the summer season on **August 5th**.



TIMELESS: SPY KIDS: ALL THE TIME IN THE WORLD

Robert Rodriguez, please can you just give us *Sin City 2* instead? I mean, the *Spy Kids* film were entertaining and all when they first came out, but surely you must also think that going on to a fourth installment is a bit too much? Did you not see *Pirates of the Caribbean 4*?

Okay, slight rant is over. *Spy Kids 4*, subtitled *All The Time In The World*, is the next installment in director Rodriguez's family series, which depicted the adventures of two young siblings who discovered their parents were international spies, with gadgets and gizmos that made Q go green with envy.

However, the two young actors in question - Alexa Vega and Daryl Sabara - are all grown up now and are thus no longer the main focus of the franchise. However, they do return in this installment (albeit in supporting roles) while the likes of Jessica Alba (*Sin City*), Jeremy Piven (*Entourage*) and the voice of Ricky Gervais (*The Office*) are front and center.

Jessica Alba plays Marissa Cortez Wilson, a retired spy who has

division, while Rebecca and Cecil must put aside their bickering once they discover Marissa's secret identity and rely on their wits to help save the world - but not before some help from some rather familiar *Spy Kids*, Carmen (Vega) and Juni Cortez (Sabara). 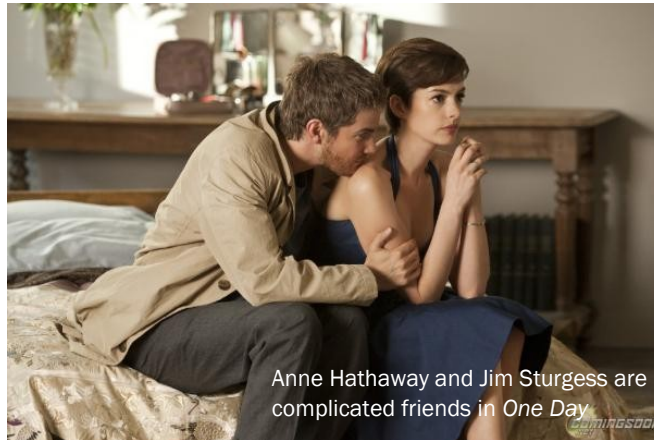
TRUE LOVE TAKES ITS TIME: *ONE DAY*

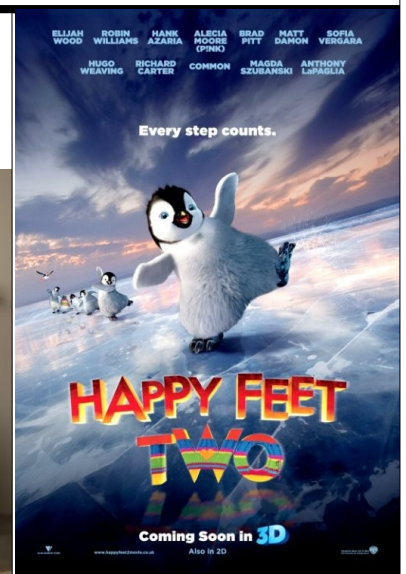
On July 15th 1988, Emma (Hathaway) and Dexter (Sturgess) spend the night together after their university graduation, in the process beginning a friendship that

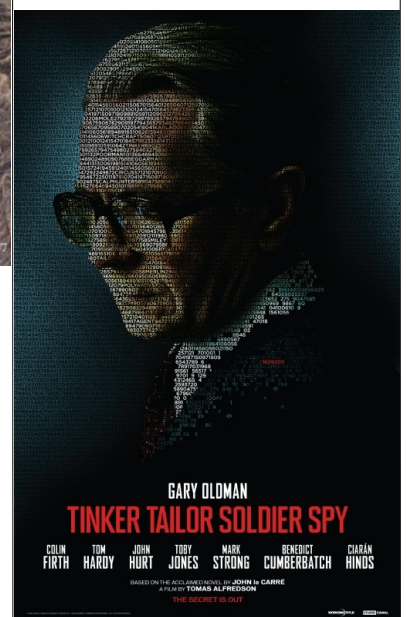

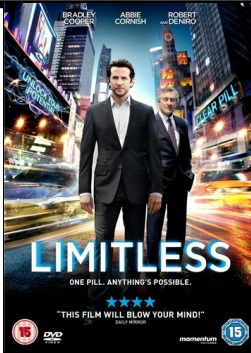


Jason Momoa fights evil forces with a horrific haircut in *Conan the Barbarian*

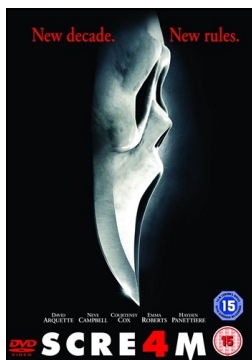

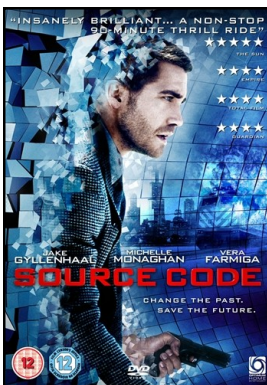

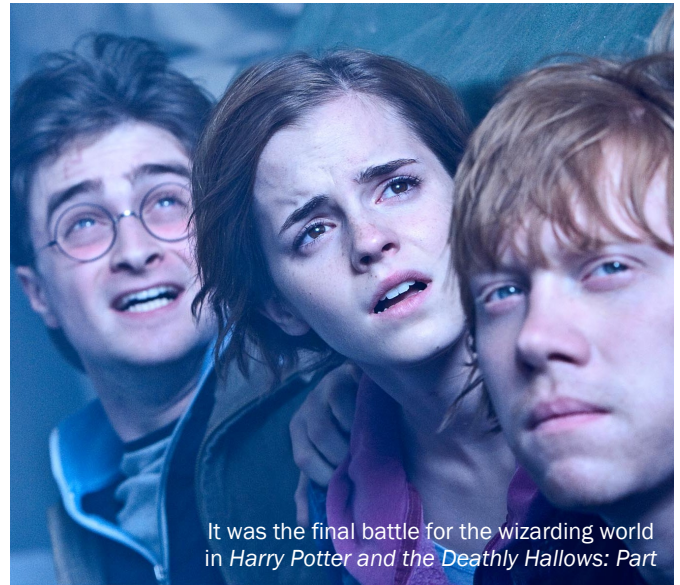

Up first on July 1st, Robert Redford directed a thrilling courtroom drama centered on the assassination of Abraham Lincoln in *The Conspirator*; Tom Hanks went back to school in *Larry Crowne*; and Michael Bay turned the action up to 11 in *Transformers: Dark of the Moon*.

Then, on the 8th, Jesse Eisenberg smuggled drugs in the delayed *Holy Rollers*; Noel Clarke proved to be an unfunny comedian (in the film) in *Huge*; Rainn Wilson's superhero made *Kick-Ass* look like *Peppa Pig* in *Super*; Terrence Malick's long-awaited *The Tree of Life* dazzled and confused moviegoers; and David Schwimmer highlighted the dangers of online grooming in *Trust*. But, on the 15th, it finally arrived - after ten years of watching him and his friends grow up, it was finally

The end of the month came at last on the 29th, with the releases of WW2-era superhero flick *Captain America: The First Avenger*, with Chris Evans in the

title role; the family flick *Horrid Henry: The Movie* which managed to entertain young'uns over the country; and the Kevin James-starring talking animals film *Zookeeper*, which at least managed to make idiots completely satisfied. So once more, July has proven itself to be one for the ages, and surely one to beat (until next July, when we've got *The Dark Knight Rises* and *The Amazing Spider-Man* to get excited for...)

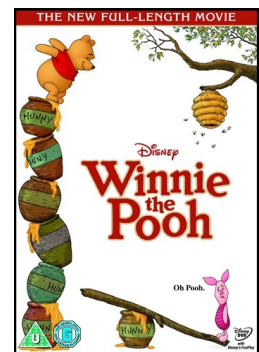
Bateman and Ryan Reynolds swap bodies in *The Change-Up*; Sarah Jessica Parker becomes the breadwinner in her family in *I Don't Know How She Does It*; Gary Oldman leads a stellar British cast in espionage thriller adaptation *Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy*; and it is discovered how love can be found at music festivals in *You Instead*. On the 23rd, Steve Carell acquires relationship advice from Ryan Gosling in *Crazy, Stupid, Love*; the critically-acclaimed *Drive* (also starring Ryan Gosling) arrives on UK shores; there's something to entertain the kids with *Judy Moody and the Bummer Summer* (trying hard not to laugh at that ridiculous title); surfing is shown to be 'armless fun (you'll understand when you see it) in *Soul Surfer*;

and Tom Hardy competes against his brother Joel Edgerton in mixed martial arts flick *Warrior*. Finally, on the 30th, *Twilight* star Taylor Lautner flexes his action muscle in *Abduction*; the long-delayed film *The Debt* is finally released in cinemas; Kirsten Dunst shows us why she won Best Actress at Cannes in Lars Von Trier's *Melancholia*; cult director Kevin Smith has a dab at horror in *Red State*; the latest 3D monster flick is upon us with *Shark Night 3D*; and Anna Faris is on a desperate search for the right man in *What's Your Number?* It's clear that, despite the summer season being over, the movie industry - as can be seen by what's on offer in September - is more alive than ever.
